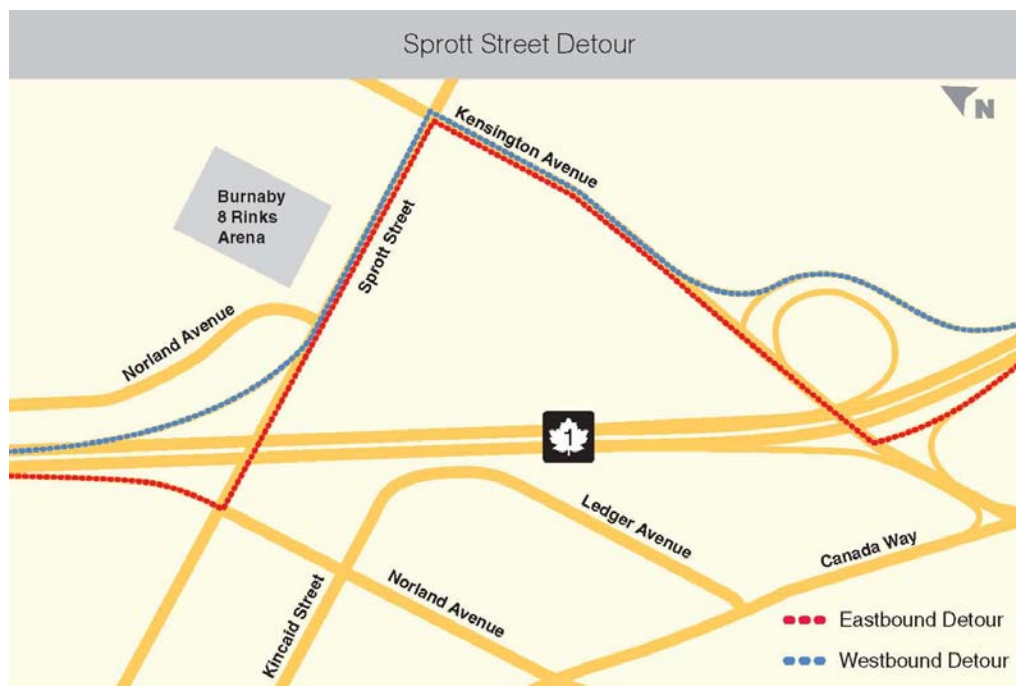


CONSTRUCTION BULLETIN

Temporary Highway 1 Detour Near Sprott Street in Burnaby

In Burnaby, work has begun to rebuild and widen the Sprott Street overpass to four lanes. Construction will take place in two stages to ensure that the overpass will remain open to traffic, pedestrians and cyclists. Once the rebuild is complete, the new structure will feature a multi-use path for pedestrians and cyclists.

In order to ensure public safety, the work on this structure will require a temporary detour for Highway 1 traffic. During the week of September 21, 2009, traffic will be detoured off Highway 1 between 12 am and 4 am for three consecutive nights. This detour will be well-marked and traffic delays/disruptions should be minimal due to low traffic volumes at this time.



- Westbound traffic will exit Highway 1 at Kensington Avenue and proceed along Kensington Avenue, turning left on Sprott Street and re-entering Highway 1 using the westbound Sprott Street on-ramp.
- Eastbound traffic will exit Highway 1 at Sprott Street, turning left to continue along Sprott Street, then right on Kensington Avenue and re-entering Highway 1 at the Kensington Avenue Interchange.

Please obey all posted signage as well as traffic control personnel.

The **Port Mann / Highway 1 Improvement Project** is part of the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure's Gateway Program, which will improve roads and bridges for people, goods and transit throughout Metro Vancouver.
