Notice of a Traffic Pattern Change on Highway 1 Eastbound at Johnson Hill

Starting December 18, 2009, the outside shoulder lane on Highway 1 eastbound at Johnson Hill that starts just after the Port Mann Bridge will now begin approximately 350 metres further east. This minor traffic pattern change is being implemented as part of the Port Mann/Highway 1 Improvement Project and **does not affect the 152nd Street exit ramps.**

This change will make way for a construction staging and storage area where a gantry crane will be installed, which will later be used to place the pre-cast segments of the new bridge. Travellers can expect to see new traffic delineators, which will separate the construction area from the roadway.

This traffic pattern change will be in effect for approximately two and a half years.

Please use caution when travelling through a construction zone and adhere to posted construction zone speed limits. Traffic fines are double in construction zones.
