Notice of Construction Near the 176 Street Eastbound Weigh Scale

As part of the Port Mann/Highway 1 Improvement (PMH1) Project, members of the trucking industry are advised that beginning on March 17, a traffic pattern change will occur on Highway 1 near the eastbound weigh scale between 160 Street and 176 Street.

To facilitate the widening of Highway 1, the eastbound traffic lanes will be shifted to the south. As a result of this change, the entrance to the weigh scale will be narrowed slightly.

The **weigh scale will remain open** and regular operations will continue. This area will be well-signed and drivers are reminded to obey posted construction speeds to promote safety in construction zones.

A key goal of the PMH1 project is to maximize predictability during construction and minimize disruption for commuters, goods movers, residents and the public. Construction updates will be issued regularly as the project progresses.
