Upcoming Permanent Traffic Pattern Change 152 Street/Highway 1 Interchange

Residents and the travelling public are advised that on July 26, 2010, the **110 Avenue on-ramp to Highway 1 westbound from Fraser Heights in Surrey will be permanently closed**. This will allow for continuing construction of the Port Mann/Highway 1 Improvement (PMH1) Project, including the new, "local-connection" lanes to Coquitlam adjacent to Highway 1 "through-traffic" lanes. Construction of these new lanes began in early 2010 and the next phase requires the closure of the 110 Avenue on-ramp (see the blue line on the map).

As a result of the closure at 152 Street and 110 Avenue, traffic will be redirected to the 160 Street Interchange. Upon project completion, transit/HOV traffic can use the new access ramps at 156 Street.

No change to the following routes

- The Highway 1 eastbound to 152 Street exit will remain open. This exit is used to go south of Highway 1 (Guildford).
- The Highway 1 westbound access from 152 Street will remain open (see green line on the map).

Other Ongoing Construction at the 152 Street Interchange

Crews are currently working to construct the north and south walls for the new 152 Street Overpass. This new overpass structure will be built slightly west of the existing structure.

The widening of Highway 1 in this area is ongoing. In mid-July, traffic will be shifted into the median in the vicinity of the 160 Street Interchange to allow crews to construct the new 160 Street Overpass.

During the construction period, motorists can expect some nighttime lane closures on Highway 1 and 152 Street to allow for the safe movement of trucks and material into and out of construction areas. Please refer to the PMH1 website for complete lane closure details.

PMH1 Improvements to the 152 Street Interchange include:

- New four-lane on-ramp for westbound travellers (two local-connection lanes and two through-traffic lanes) onto the bridge.
- New local-connection lanes (two in each direction) on the new Port Mann Bridge will provide significant improvements for vehicles travelling between Surrey and Coquitlam.
- New pedestrian/cyclist facilities:
 - Overpass near 112 Avenue
 - Sidewalk along 152 Street that will connect to 110 Avenue
 - New off-road connection between 110 Avenue and 108 Avenue
